



Christian basics - Question 23.

(Shorter catechism of the Westminster Confession)

Question: What offices doth Christ execute as our Redeemer?

Answer: Christ, as our Redeemer, executes the offices of a Prophet, of a Priest, and of a King, both in His estate of humiliation and exaltation. Acts 3:21-22; Heb 12:25; 2 Cor 13:3; Heb 5:5-7; 7:25; Ps. 2:6; Isa 9:6-7; Matt 21:5; Ps. 2:8-11

"What are you willing to give me if I hand him over to you?" So they counted out for him thirty silver coins.
Matthew 26:15

When Judas, who had betrayed him, saw that Jesus was condemned, he was seized with remorse and returned the thirty silver coins to the chief priests and the elders. Then what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet was fulfilled: "They took the thirty silver coins, the price set on him by the people of Israel," *Matthew 27:3,9*

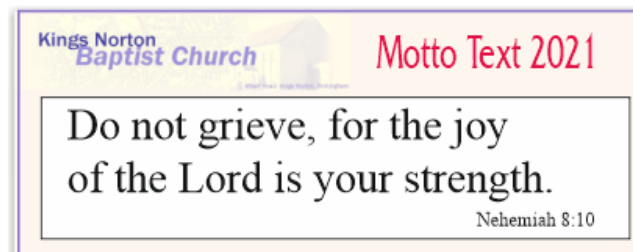


The Pharisee offers Judas 30 silver coins
